Jen Devor is a South Philly block captain, public school advocate, voting enthusiast, and a published author on civic engagement. She is the president and co-founder of Better Civics, a nonpartisan nonprofit dedicated to revolutionizing civic engagement and voter turnout through education. Better Civics works with community partners to create tools and resources that better explain how government works and to encourage individuals to be more civically engaged. In addition to her role with Better Civics, Jen also consults with companies and organizations on community outreach and civic programming.

Jen was a 2019 candidate for City Commissioner, the office that oversees election activity in Philadelphia. She ran a great race, and was endorsed by a variety of organizations including the Philadelphia Inquirer, National Organization for Women, and Run for Something.

Throughout her career, she has worked with some of Philadelphia's top civic organizations, including The Economy League of Greater Philadelphia, Amplify Philly, Campus Philly, Diversified Community Services, Neighbors Investing in Childs Elementary, and Committee of Seventy among others. Currently, Jen serves on the advisory boards of WHYY, PA Youth Vote!, DiSilvestro Recreation Center, and Vote16USA, a national nonpartisan effort to lower the voting age.

Jen holds a BS in Media and Communications from the University of the Arts. She is also an alumnus of The Center for Progressive Leadership, The Citizen Planning Institute, and several leadership programs including EMILY'S List's Run to Win, Chatham University's Ready to Run and Run For Something's candidate training. She lives in Point Breeze with her husband, Tivoni and together they have a young daughter, Ava who attends their local public school and has been canvassing with her mom since she was a newborn.



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Elinor Haider directs Pew's Philadelphia research and policy initiative. In this role, she leads Pew's efforts to help Philadelphia's policymakers and influential stakeholders address important challenges facing the city and the region. Haider works to combine Pew's evidence-based research with convenings that offer participants the opportunity to learn best practices from experts and policymakers from around the country.

Before joining Pew, Haider served as vice president of market development for Veolia North America, a global environmental company, leading marketing, government relations and sustainability functions. She previously served as CEO of NovaThermal Energy, an early stage clean tech company; deputy commerce director for Philadelphia Mayor Michael A. Nutter; chief of staff for the city's deputy mayor for economic development; and and vice president of financing for the Philadelphia Industrial Development Corporation.

Haider holds a bachelor's degree from Georgetown University, and graduate degrees from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School and Johns Hopkins University. She has served in numerous civic leadership roles, and is currently on the executive committee of the Philadelphia Outward Bound School and on the corporate board for Reed Manufacturing.



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Jovida Hill joined the administration of Mayor James F. Kenney in February 2016 as the Administrator in the Office of Diversity and Inclusion (the office has since been renamed the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion). In June 2016 Mayor Kenney appointed her to serve as Executive Director of the Philadelphia Commission for Women, a post created by a ballot initiative put to Philadelphia voters in the May 2015 Primary Election. The following year, the Mayor appointed her to serve as Executive

Director of the city's first Office of Engagement for Women.

The Office of Engagement for Women promotes civic, educational, and economic policies that enhance the lives of women and girls from all walks of life. Through public engagement, the office and the Commission for Women make recommendations to the Mayor, City Council and other policy makers that advance social justice, equal rights, and economic opportunities. The office also manages the Philadelphia Commission for Women.

Jovida has been an award-winning writer and producer of more than 200 films and videos for education, broadcast, marketing, and training for Kinocraft Media, Inc. Her work has included the civil rights series *In the Land of Jim Crow* which documents poignant first person accounts of the African American experience in pursuit of justice and equality, the series *Reinventing Democracy*, hosted by acclaimed historian Douglas Brinkley that celebrates the role of civic engagement in expanding civil rights and social justice, and the series *Celebrate* which introduces children in grades K-5 to multicultural celebrations that herald our differences to amplify our similarities. She has been awarded five CINE Golden Eagle Awards from the Council on Nontheatrical Events including her award winning "Driving While Black or Brown" Public Service Announcement for the American Civil Liberties Union, and her video for the NAACP Legal Defense and Education Fund commemorating the 50th anniversary of *the Brown v. Board of Education* Supreme Court decision. She has received honors from the Chicago Children's Film Festival, and a 2007 Art and Change Award from the Leeway Foundation for "Grandma's Kids" that sheds a light on kinship care.

As the founder and CEO of Hill Associates Public Relations specializing in nonprofit social justice advocacy, Jovida's clients included Black United Fund of Pennsylvania, Crisis Intervention Network, Taller Puertorriqueño, Congreso de Latinos Unidos, Friends of Farmworkers (now Justice at Work), Imani Business Services, Intercultural Family Services, Philadelphia Clearing House and the Odunde African American Festival among others. As a journalist, Jovida served as Arts & Entertainment Editor for the Philadelphia *Tribune*, where she was honored for "Best Entertainment Section" from the National Newspaper Publishers Association. She also served as Arts & Entertainment Editor for WDAS AM/FM radio; she was a columnist for the Philadelphia *Daily News* and was an Associate Producer for the internationally distributed PBS public affairs television program *Black Perspective on the News*.

Jovida has served as the Chair of the Philadelphia Black Women's Health Project and Scenic Philadelphia and was a founding member of the African Sister-hood and the Women Gather Conference. She is the former Vice President of the Logan Square Neighborhood Association where she continues to serve on the Board of Directors. Jovida also serves on the Board of Directors of the Black Women's Health Alliance and is an Ambassador for GALS (Girls Advocacy and Leadership Series), a leadership training program of Women's Campaign International founded by former Congresswoman Marjorie Margolies.

Most recently, Jovida received the 2019 Community Engagement Award from the Coalition of Labor Union Women (CLUW); was honored by City Council for the Philadelphia Commission for Women's advocacy on behalf of Fair Workweek scheduling for workers in the retail, fast food, and hospitality industries; and received the Philadelphia Chapter of the National Organization for Women's 2021 Shirley Chisholm Award.
